# 1. DEPARTMENT AND ADMISSION CAPACITY (EXCLUSIVE APPLICATIONS ONLY)

Year 1 (Grade 10) International Department, BC Graduation/Double Diploma Program (abbreviated as BC/DD). Limited spaces are available.

## 2. ELIGIBILITY

Those who were born before April 1, 2010 and meet one of the following criteria.

\*\* Returnee students (those who have studied abroad during their junior high school years in Japan) must submit the Eligibility Form (Application Form 3) before submitting your application. We will confirm your eligibility to apply. Please download the eligibility verification form from the QR code on the right.

### **Category 1**

- Those who have spent **18 months or more (total time including occasional returns to Japan)** of the Japanese compulsory educational period **abroad and will still be residing abroad** as of the end of December 2024 and meet the following criterion.
  - Those who have completed Grade 9 at a local or international school abroad, or who are due to complete it by June 2025.

#### Category 2:

- Those who have spent **18 months or more (total time including occasional returns to Japan)** of the Japanese compulsory educational period abroad but will **have been back in Japan for no more than 2 years** as of March 31, 2025, and meet the following criteria.
  - o Graduates, or those expected to graduate in March 2025, of junior high schools in Japan.
  - o Those who have completed Grade 9 at an international school (in Japan) equivalent to that of a Japanese junior high school or those who are due to complete Grade 9 by June 2025.

# **Category 3:**

- Those who have spent **18 months or more (total time including occasional returns to Japan)** of the Japanese compulsory educational period abroad but will **have been back in Japan for more than 2 years** as of March 31, 2025.
  - Graduates, or those expected to graduate in March 2025, of a full-time overseas Japanese junior high school as designated by the Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
  - o Graduates, or those expected to graduate in March 2025, of junior high schools in Japan.
  - \*Students who have been in the Japanese education system for more than 3 years will, in principle, be treated as regular applicants.

#### **Category 4:**

• Those who hold foreign nationality and reside in Japan (excluding those with "Permanent Resident" and "Spouse of Permanent Resident" status as defined by the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act), whose native language is not Japanese and have completed school education through Grade 9 (equivalent to Japanese compulsory education) or who are due to complete it by June 2025.

**Note:** The eligibility of those with no experience overseas but who are receiving education under a foreign education system will be assessed case-by-case. Please consult with us.

- BC English and BC Interview.

- 3. Tuition and other fees (planned for SY2025)

Enrollment fee: **230,000 yen**; Textbooks and uniforms: approx. **150,000 yen** Some textbooks will be BC digital textbooks.

Tuition for the first year: approximate cost

- Tuition 838,000 yen (paid in 4 installments)
- Educational enrichment fee **36,000 yen** (paid in 4 installments)
- PTA, community organization, school year fee, etc. 70,570 yen (one-time payment)
- Cost of study abroad: approx. 980,000 yen
- → For students enrolling in 2025, a study abroad program is scheduled to take place in the

second year of study. Fees will be collected after the students advance to the second year.

- School excursion deposits: **260,000 yen** (paid in two installments, participation is optional, additional fees apply)
- \* In addition, a laptop computer purchase fee (approximately 160,000 yen) is required at the time of enrollment.
  - \* Our school qualifies for the "High School Tuition Support Fund System" (new aid system from MEXT) implemented in 2024.
